


SITUATION OVERVIEW

According to OCHA **1.2 million people have been displaced** by fighting since Armed Opposition Groups took Anbar in January (approximately 560,000 people from Anbar, with a further 650,000 people leaving their homes when Mosul was taken on 9 June). This comes on top of a population of more than 225,000 Syrian refugees already displaced in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq (KRI) and adds to an already stretched humanitarian response.

OUR RESPONSE

Save the Children has worked in Iraq since 1991 and since 2009 has been established as the leading INGO for children in Northern and Southern Iraq. We began our response to the displacement in Anbar in January 2014, and are now aiming to reach **240,000** people in response to the unfolding IDP crisis in the country.

So far we have reached **80,303** people across 7 governorates in Iraq.



Save the Children is actively coordinating with governments, UN agencies and other NGOs to respond to the humanitarian crisis.

CURRENT ACTIVITIES

-We have procured 16 CFS tents for use in Erbil and Dohuk, and 3 CFS are now up and running. In Erbil 220 children are attending the CFS on a regular basis

-The CFS in Garmawa has currently registered 308 children from 3 to 17 years old


-We are running a mobile Child Protection unit for children in hard to reach locations, and have identified further communities for these activities in North Ninewa

-8 facilitators have been trained on EDDC in Khazir camp and 96 children (aged 3-6) are participating in ECCD activities; these activities will help to prepare children for school and maximise their learning

-Over 500 work and reading books have been delivered to Khazir and Garmawa camp integrated spaces
-33 teachers have been hired to run 3 catch-up schools in urban areas for IDP and refugee children in Erbil and 3 catch-up schools began classes on 8 July, making sure children do not fall behind on their education

-We have distributed more than 900 hygiene kits (benefitting nearly 5,000 individuals), and hygiene vouchers benefitting 3,169 people, across our area of response, as well as distributed water in Dohuk

-We are also responding the sectors of Shelter, NFI and FSL, having distributed thousands of shelter/sleeping kits, mattresses and blankets and food vouchers, amongst other items
