WEEKLY REPORT 24-28 AUGUST 2014

PROTECTION ASSISTANCE AND REINTEGRATION CENTER (PARC) IN CAMP & NON-CAMP AREAS/ UNHCR PROGRAM

- PARC team did 3 field visits in (Zakho/Batifa and Bedar 3) and (Duhok/Etit) for 18 families/76 individuals to assess the needs of the SAS and identify vulnerable individuals.
- PARC team referred 4 cases of SAS to different concerned NGOs and hospitals that Harikar has coordination with, to be provided with assistance and services.
- Providing SAS from camp and non-camp areas with legal assistance by PARC lawyers; (4) received cases, (3) resolved case and (4) legal advice cases.
- QIPs team site visited to Barokh School, Thalassemia Center and Rheumatic Diseases Center to monitor the interventions and check the quality of materials provided by the company such as classroom desks, whiteboards, and other rehabilitation materials.
- Negotiations and signing contract with the company to start the provision of equipment for health centers/hospitals.
- Site visit to Zakho youth Center and the women shelter in Duhok to do an assessment for new QIPs.
- Meeting with the head of directorate of youth centers in Duhok, to coordinate and update them about youth/community related QIPs.
- PARC team started assessing families for the Unconditional Cash Assistance program in urban areas.
- PARC team, so far, identified 81 cases and are ready to be reviewed by panel board for approval.
- The total clients/cases received by HAIKAR-WLC/Domiz and Gawilan camps were (47), (17) cases of them were GBV cases while the other (30) cases were NON-GBV.
- WLC/Domiz did two mobilization visits have been arranged and done this week.
- WLC/Domiz visited DMC to follow up a case of providing with a tent.
- An information session held by WLC-Gawelan about (Domestic Violence), 14 women attended this session.

- WLC/Gawilan visited Bardarash/DCVAW for the purpose of coordination with them.
- Harikar CSA team referred one case of SAS in Zakho/Batifa to Hivi Nazdar NGO for getting further medical tests and support.
- Harikar CSA team referred two cases of SAS in (Zakho/Batifa and Baradarsh/Daratoo) to Registration Centre in Domiz Camp for adding family members.
- Harikar CSA team referred one case of SAS in Zakho/Batifa to Khabor hospital for getting free medical support.
- CSA team with QIP colleagues visited Newa Center in Duhok/KRO Street to identify their needs. The center is specialized of rehabilitating women who were suffered from different types of SGBV.
- CSA team solved a previously followed up SAS registration case in Duhok by visiting Residency Directorate and Registration Center in Domiz Camp.
- CSA team identified 15 SAS families that were favourable for the Unconditional Cash Assistance program in urban areas.

Medical Reimbursement Program

- CSA with Harikar medical supervisor visited Misserike and Gregawra for Medical Reimbursement Program and identifying the medical cases. During the visit to Misserike, 3 cases were identified as follows:
 - A young girl had loin pain and poor renal functioning. Double G. stent putted need continuous follow up and monitoring of renal function.
 - An old female had hypertension, gallstone, and gastric problem. Most of her medications are not available in P.H.S.
 - Middle aged male had ischemic heart disease. He needs continuous treatment. Most of the medications are not available in P.H.S.
- While the visit to Gregawra village, Harikar medical supervisor along with CSA assist one case as follow:
 - A middle aged male had chronic urinary tract infection he needs follow up and treatment, medications are not available in primary center.
- **Challenges**
 - Difficulty to satisfy the refugees about the criteria of the medical reimbursement program because they believe their cases are vulnerable as well, while their diseases are simple and they didn't had serious medical problems. And they blamed the team for not taking care of them.
 - Until now the distribution of help to any medical case was not offered since 5 months from now.

- Two mobilization visits have been arranged and done this week.
- WLC/Domiz visited DMC to follow up a case of providing with a tent.

- An information session held by WLC-Gawilan about (Domestic Violence), 14 women attended this session.
- One new GBV case has been received.
- Gawilan/WLC staff did two mobilization visits to inside the camp.
- Gawilan/WLC borrowed 3 books to women.
- Gawilan/WLC visited Bardarash/DCVAW for the purpose of coordination with them.

HARIKAR LEGAL CLINIC

- During the reporting period, a total of 15 cases were received in both legal clinic office and during the outreach visits. Among the 15 cases, 4 were full legal representation and 11 were legal consultations. The 4 full legal representations were (2 Criminal Defense , 1 Obtaining identification documents , 1 Selling allowances) The 11 legal consultations were (1 Obtaining IDs for IDPs ,3 Obtaining identification documents , 2 Proving/registering Marriage , 1 Divorce , 1 Criminal Defense, 1 Birth Certificate , 2 Assistance accessing government benefits). The legal consultations were given by the clinic lawyers on various legal issues to the clients approached the clinic office and met during the outreach visits.
- Regarding the outreach visits, 3 visits were paid to Domiz, Sumel and Zaxo districts. The team was consisted of a lawyer and a social worker. The visits covered the courthouses, women unions and IDPs sites
- Legal clinic leaflet have been distributed during the reporting period (130) leaflets In Domiz district.



HARIKAR HYGIENE EDUCATION AND PROMOTION PROJECT

Harikar and PWJ staffs continued their activity under the project of Hygiene Promotion Program in Duhok. According to the project plans shared with PWJ as a request to share with the other agencies about the plan of the Hygiene Promotion project, Harikar's staff is undertaking the tent to tent visits along with the HP volunteers for the areas left in Domiz camp with the presentation of workshops "Focus Groups". In this week the HP volunteers visited around 520 families from sector

31 to 37 , also some families in irregular areas below the main road as long as all the random tents from sector 1 to 37, therefore all the families in these sectors are covered.

About the workshops, we have done 3 workshops which were presented by Harikar's hygiene promoter with PWJ staff and some volunteers, 2 workshops in Domiz camp and 1 in Akre camp. The workshops have remarkable effects on the participants because the topics and videos presented are really useful. Most of the women in the workshops have praised the workshop and have taken benefit of it. During each workshop, first one in Domiz camp in sector 10 by the attendance of 7 women, the second one also in Domiz camp in sector 17 with the same number of attendances. In Akre this time the workshop was in a different sector and around 7 women participated in one of the participant's household. In each workshop videos are presented with their clear explanation by our staff, also discussion and conversation have taken place among the participants about the related topics.



Plans for next week:

- Continue Tent to tent visit in Domiz Camp
- Presenting three workshops "Focus Groups" one in Akre and two in Domiz camp with displaying short videos.

- In this week a workshop on early marriage has been presented by social workers for more than 40 women in LSC, by which the attendance discussed the main reasons that lead to early marriage and the effect of the early marriage on couples and families as well.
- LSC coordinated with Domiz2 camp management for receiving Legal and Social cases.
- The total number of Legal and social cases received in this week are **47** cases.



Legal Social Center for IDPs in Sharya

-After two weeks of preparations this week center of legal and social service for IDPs in Sharya received (25) cases and the cases were as the following:

- 11 cases were legal (issuing marriage certificates)
- 1 consultation for criminal defense
- 13 were social cases.

-Social worker presented a seminar about Effects of war on women and how to get over it and change their life for the better. The seminar held on Thursday in Sharya for IDPs.

-On Sunday and Thursday a delegation from UNDP visited the center and discussed IDPs situations.



Child Friendly Space

Child Friendly Space could enroll a number of children and youth from Domiz Camp in the various activities and lectures of the week such as: hygiene awareness, dance, listening short stories, painting, and first aids program for parents, music, sports, art crafts, and flexibility with the parents program. Children who participated and attended the activities were 700 children between the ages of (4-17). The purpose form the activities was to fill the spare time the children have and those activities were held in Kulilik and Nergiz centers at Domiz Camp.

Community Cohesion in Northern Iraq (CCNI)

Major Achievements:

- GTI staff conducted a meeting with IRD on Sunday at 9:00 am, at 24 August. 2014 the meeting discussed about GTI project and rehearsal of Duhok Group.
- In this week Miss. Ruqaya arrived to Duhok for the last day of training the actors and attended the first performance of new scenario.
- The first performance conducted on Thursday at 11:30 pm, at 28 Aug. 2014 and (42) audience attended.

Major Achievements up to date:

- 7 days of rehearsing were conducted.
- 1 performance of the third scenario conducted up to date.
- The number of audience reached 42 persons.

Plans for Next Week:

- Duhok team will be preparing for the second performance on Sunday at 6:00 pm, at 31 Aug. 2014 in the Tanahy – Sumel.

Pending issues:

- It supposed the first performance conducted in Domiz but it's conducted in Duhok because Miss Ruqaya requested the first performance must be in Duhok.
- The actors didn't abide by their time to first performance.

Others:

- The GTI staff requested from the actors to make a meeting with them but they didn't come to the meeting.



Harikar-UNFPA

Major Achievements:

- UNFPA Staff did 3 field visits to (Domiz, Fiyda, sumeel, and Khanke) for 731 families/708 individuals to assess the needs of the SAS and identify vulnerable individuals.

- Staff of UNFPA and SAS made distribution to IDPs Domiz, Fiyda, Sumel and Khanke to 425 families.
- Staff UNFPA coordinated with DMC to distribute inside Duhok and Filed Assessment in Domiz, Fiyda, Sumel and Khanke
- Minutes meeting with NGO and GOV of DUHOK, to coordinate and collaborate with UNFPA in Dilshad PLS 2 at 25 August 2014.

Plans for Next Week:

- UNFPA Staff has distribution to IDPs inside Duhok, Mangesh and Zawita
- Staff UNFPA have filed in three location in Duhok (inside Duhok, Mangesh, and Zawita) for SAS to identify their vulnerable individuals , women and girls.
- Staff UNFPA had training on GBV cases for three days.

Risks/Challenges:

- UNFPA staff had on more risk when talking to women psychological problems, the first one:-
 - *The number of Psychological ailments (680) individuals.
 - *Number of disabled people staying in place assessment (5)
 - *Lack of feeding to pregnant women
 - *Lack of sanitation unite, 300 people use only one sanitation unite and in night be closed.

Needs:-

- *women Dresses
- *Dignity kids
- *White cloth dresses for women aged 35 and older
- *Medication
- *Chairs for disables
